Scope: This statement summarizes the Campus Druid Network’s annual programming, services, and engagement opportunities.

The Campus Druid Network provides multifaith, religious, cultural, and community support and engagement opportunities for all Durham College students. Currently through but not limited to Druidry, Wiccan, Pagan, Animistic, and land based spiritual traditions.

Direct Engagement:

- 8 Druidic rituals annually.
Imbolc, Hybrid Spring Vernal Equinox, Beltane, Summer Solstice, Autumn Equinox, Samhain, Winter Solstice hosted by Dancing Lights Grove.
- 8 Wiccan rituals annually.
Imbolc, Ostara, Beltane, Litha, Lammass, Harvast Tide, Samhain and Yule hosted by New Wiccan Church of Canada.
- 2+ student led events.
Movie Screenings, Intros, classes, workshops.
- 2+ guest facilitator led event.
Movie Screenings, Intros, classes, workshops.
Often hosted by Durham College or Durham College Alumni.
- 1 tent at Durham’s annual Durham Pagan Pride Day.
hosted by Durham Pagans.
- 3+ club crawl and outreach table events.
hosted by Durham College Student Association.

Passive Engagement:

- Private meetings available with team on a request-by-request basis on campus.
- Encourages leadership and initiative among students.
- Promotes Druidry and land based spiritual paths throughout campus life.
- Provides guides and details regarding local Pagan related activities and organizations.
- Supports social infrastructure for Paganism and Animism within Durham Region student communities.

Occasional Activity:

Registers bookings with the campus multi faith prayer room on a need-by-need basis.

Future commitments (currently in process of connecting):

- At least one stand in support of an Indigenous-led movement, e.g., Moose Hide Campaign Day or Free Grassy Narrows.
